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IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- The Associate and Bachelor's Degree in Nursing are accredited by ACEN (Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing).
- **Requirements for Admission to Nursing Program:**
 - Meet all admission standards established in the General Catalog.
 - Have a minimum GPA of 2.50 from high school or place of origin.
 - To be eligible for third year courses must have successfully completed the requirements of the first two years of the Bachelor of Science in Nursing from a recognized and accredited institution of higher education. Candidates who bring an associate degree must complete all general education requirement established by the institution.
 - At the moment of admission to the program evidence of any permanent license acquired must be presented.
- **Requirements for Clinical Practice:**

The student is responsible for submitting their credentials in original and copy during the first two weeks of class to each practice course professor.

 - Health Certificate (valid for one year)
 - Certificate of Good Conduct of Puerto Rico (valid for three months)
 - Certificate of Immunization: Hepatitis B (three doses, Chicken Pox (two doses) and Influenza (annual). If 10 years have passed since your last Hepatitis B and Varicella vaccine, a titer test with a reactive result issued by an authorized laboratory will be required.
 - CPR – American Heart Association (valid for two years)
 - Respirator Training – N-95 (valid for one year)
 - Law 300 (valid for one year)
 - University Identification Card (color copy)
 - Certification of OSHA, HIPAA and Infection Control
 - CPI – Defense Training Certificate – Only for NURS 2362 Practice of Psychosocial Care
 - Nose and Throat Culture - *Dr. Ramon Ruiz Arnau University Hospital*
 - Drug Test - *Menonita & Instituto de Psicopedagógico*
 - Recent Photo (2x2) - *Doctor's Hospital*
 - Medical Plan ID Card - *Doctor's Hospital*
 - Resume - *Doctor's Hospital*
 - Birth Certificate - *University District Hospital (UDH)*
 - If necessary, any other document required by practical scenario, will be requested by the course professor.
- **Uniform:**
 - Practice courses at the NESH – Scrub (exclusive from the University Bookstore, first floor) and white nursing shoes.
 - Practice courses outside the University - Gala Uniform.
 - ✓ Women - Mint Green Uniform - exclusive from the University Bookstore (first floor) and white nursing shoes.
 - ✓ Men – White Uniform and white nursing shoes.
- **Policy regarding nursing curriculum plan:**
 - The Nursing concentration trimester courses will be offered and taken according to the current Curriculum Plan.
 - If for any reason a student completes the required general education courses, the student **CANNOT** advance or merge any nursing course out of sequence.
 - If needed, the student should see an academic counselor that can advise them on the option of selecting a minor concentration that can be taken to complete full time status credits.
- For the Associate Degree in Nursing students are required to complete 50% of the major credits in the campus from which they expect to receive the degree. This also applies to the Bachelor's Degree.
- Academic counseling is recommended during your 2nd year (First trimester for AASN students) & 3rd year (First Trimester for BSN students). For academic counselling, student must present an unofficial transcript (INTERWEB copy) and curriculum plan. Evaluations made by the nursing department are **UNOFFICIAL**; student must request Registration Office an official academic evaluation at least one trimester prior to completing their degree.
